CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

1.1. Background

According to the search results, the contribution of the tourism industry to Indonesia's GDP in 2020 was 2.24% (Statista, 2023). The World Travel & Tourism Council (WTTC) predicts that the tourism sector will be a driving force behind the country's economic recovery and it is expected to create more than five million new jobs over the next decade (World Travel & Tourism Council, 2023). The WTTC also shows that the sector is expected to grow at an average annual rate of 10% between 2022 and 2023, twice the rate of the overall economy, which is forecasted to grow by 5.1%. The sector's contribution to GDP will reach IDR 1.692 trillion, injecting additional IDR 1.042 trillion to the economy and representing 5.7% of the total economy (World Travel & Tourism Council, 2023).

Bali is one of the most popular tourist destinations in the world, with millions of foreign visitors arriving each year. The top five countries dominating foreign tourist arrivals in Bali in July 2023 were Australia, India, China, the United Kingdom, and the United States (Theurillat, 2023). In April 2023, the top five countries dominating foreign tourist arrivals in Bali were Australia, India, China, the United Kingdom, and the United States (Muthiariny, 2023a).

In the last two years, Indonesia has experienced significant growth in its hotel and tourism industry. The country's beautiful beaches, stunning landscapes, and rich cultural heritage have made it a popular destination for international tourists looking for an exotic holiday experience. This growth is particularly evident in Bali, which has seen a steady increase in foreign visitors over the past few years. According to data from Statista (2021), the number of foreign visitors to Bali has risen from 6.23 million in 2018 to 7.06 million in 2019, with the majority coming from Australia, China, and Japan. This trend bodes well for Indonesia's overall tourism industry, which is expected to continue growing as more people discover the country's unique attractions and hospitality offerings. As such, hotels and other tourism-related businesses are being built or expanded across the country to cater to this increasing demand, making Indonesia a compelling destination for investors looking to capitalize on its potential as one of Asia's fastest-growing economies.

Before the pandemic, Bali was a popular destination for both Japanese and Korean travelers, with statistics showing a steady increase in visitors from both countries. In 2019 alone, there were approximately 192,000 Japanese visitors and 112,000 Korean visitors to Bali. However, due to the outbreak of COVID-19, these numbers plummeted as countries-imposed travel restrictions and people refrained from unnecessary travel. As a result, Bali's tourism industry has suffered greatly. The Indonesian government has put various measures in place to mitigate the impact of the pandemic on the economy and the tourism sector. These include vaccine distribution, strict health protocols for tourists and locals alike, and targeted campaigns to attract domestic tourists. While it remains uncertain when international travel will fully resume again, Bali continues to work towards its recovery by adapting to new norms and providing safe experiences for all travelers.

1.3. Time and Procedure of Internship

1. Pre-Placement

- On 07 August 2023, writers came to submit the requirements and have a 3 days orientation until 10 August 2023.
